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The above-captioned matter came on for hearing on June 7, 2005 before the undersigned pursuant to the ex parte motion for expedited discovery of Plaintiff Sierra Corporate Design, Inc.. ("Sierra"). Sierra appeared via its counsel, Timothy M. O'Keeffe, Esq. and Christopher J. Harristhal.

Sierra has, since the time of originally serving its motion for expedited discovery, been informed that the defendant's medical condition renders him unable to participate in a deposition at this time, and Sierra has withdrawn its request to depose the defendant for now.

THE FOLLOWING IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Sierra's motion for expedited discovery is GRANTED in part.
2. Defendant, through his legal guardian and/or legal counsel, shall produce responsive items and documents as demanded in Plaintiff's First Request for Production of Documents and Things as modified herein, and cooperate in inspection thereof, No. 1, to wit:
 - a.) Request No. 1. Produce for the purpose of allowing plaintiff to make a forensic image, all computers, hard drives, floppy disks and other storage devices, including magnetic storage devices, in the defendant's home, automobile, and otherwise known by the defendant's guardian to be in defendant's possession.

3. Plaintiff, through its expert witness John DeLozier, shall be permitted to image and copy all computers and storage devices produced pursuant to this order. Defendant's legal guardian shall cooperate in the production and identification of the requested items.


4. Defendant shall not be required to appear for deposition in light of his current medical condition.
