Following I have included the documents we have pertaining to "dritz.mako.ath.cx". We do not have any records pertaining to a number of the items in your Exhibit A, but I have included all documents we do have. I have lettered these documents in the upper left corner, and will describe them in detail below.

Document A (1 page): The account listing for username "dritz" as of June 8th, when we originally received your request. This shows the e-mail address bofh+dyndns@wi.rr.com used by this individual. It also shows the user ID for this account, "2001978". At this time, there was nothing in the account.

Document B (2 pages): This is a printout from our Authorize.Net merchant gateway, showing a purchase made on the "dritz" account on February 29th, 2004. The purchase amount of \$24.95 indicates that this purchase was for our Custom DNS service, but it has expired and no longer exists in the account. The fields in this document should be pretty much self-explanatory, and detail the credit card holder's information for this purchase. Specifically, they identify David Ritz as the individual purchasing service, demonstrating his ownership of this "dritz" account. Note that the Customer ID here matches the user ID (they are the same item, just different terms) in Document A.

Document C (1 page): This is the account listing for username "dritz" as of today. It appears that this account was recently re-created (notice the user ID is now 3536549). The e-mail address is now bofh@wi.rr.com – this is the same effective address as before, because the "plus" notation in e-mail addresses is used for local filtering only, the base of the previous address would have simply been "bofh", just as it is here. The account now contains one hostname, mako.ath.cx, which is the hostname that was of interest originally. Logs for this hostname are included as Document D. The fields relating to the hostname indicate that it is currently pointed to "69.76.79.48", and was set to that IP address on June 28th 2005 at 18:25:34 EDT (GMT-0400). They also indicate that the "wildcard" feature is enabled, which would allow hostnames of the form "*.mako.ath.cx" (including "dritz.mako.ath.cx") to point to the same IP address as mako.ath.cx itself.

Document D (1 page): This page is the log listing for mako.ath.cx. It has only been updated once in the past 14 days (the period for which we keep logs), on June 28th (as mentioned above). The "host" column indicates the IP address our web site was accessed from (the actual computer being used to make the change), while the "ip" column indicates the IP address the hostname was directed to. The "useragent" column indicates that the web browser being used was Apple's Safari browser on a Macintosh system.
